#### On Wednesday, September 20th, 2023

At Bayt Al-Hakim Restaurant in the presence of the organization's founder, Mr. Mahdi Yahya, and as part of the "Local Youth Lead" project, Peace of Art organized a townhall meeting among stakeholders and activists from the region with the support of ARK group. The session included Mr. Fadi Abi Allam, the former Minister of Displaced Persons, founder of the Permanent Peace Movement Permanent Peace Movement (PPM), and leader of the Green Party in Lebanon; Mr. Fayez Okasha, a social activist, human rights advocate, and founder of the **Development Indicators Association;** Colonel Mahboub Aoun, a lecturer at the Doha Institute for Graduate Studies in Qatar; Ms. Rawan Yaghi, founder of the USPEaK organization;

Mr. Houssein Shouman, Executive Director of Nabad for Development; Mr. Malik Al-Arab, a founding member of the Jousour Al-Nour Association; and Dr. Mustafa Sukkariya, a social activist. ## Fostering Peace through Collaboration: Women, Youth, Peace & Security in Lebanon Partners (WYPS)

The National Women's Committee in Lebanon, in collaboration with Search for Common Ground launched Lebanon's National Action Plan on Women, Peace, and Security (Resolution 1325), supported by the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA).

Peace of Art has joined efforts with partner organizations from all over Lebanon to build on the National Action Plan on Women, Peace and Security, as well as its intersection with the Youth, Peace and Security agenda. The program aims to discuss recommendations and strategies for WYPS, and enhance the capacities of organizations in the women's and youth rights networks.

The discussions covered adversarial versus cooperative approaches, insights into the UNSCR resolutions, and strategies for dealing with UNSCR 2250 and 1325. The program included evaluations, emphasizing the commitment to collaborative efforts for peace-building in Lebanon.
